	Step 1 - Ask their and then introduce yourself. Calling someone by name not only shows that you are interested in who they are, but also tells them that they are important.
•	Step 2 – Ask them a question to why they have come for prayer:
	How can I pray for you? What is God saying to you? What is it that caused you to ask for prayer?
•	Step 3 – Ask For laying hands on them, ask them if you can lay your hand on their shoulder. If they respond "No," please honor their request. For healing, ask them if you could anoint them with oil. If they respond "No," please honor their request.

VI. WRAPPING UP
